#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 21st issue of the 2nd year of the President's News Digest.

I would like to start this edition by thanking all colleagues who helped with the preparation submission of our institutional and accreditation application to the HEC today. This is a milestone activity and achieving



institutional accreditation is a top priority for the Board of Directors and Board of Trustees and all of us.

On Wednesday and Thursday of last week, the Dome Hall was buzzing with more than 40 colleagues who helped in editing the application and its supporting documents which include university prospectus, programmes handbooks, details CVs and job descriptions of the senior management and all academic staff amongst many other documents. The HEC will soon start scrutinizing our application and the website. If we meet all their requirements, they will plan an inspection visit. Four weeks before the inspection visit, they will ask us to submit our SER and all supporting documents. This is a very demanding task, but we are at a very advanced stage in our SER report preparation and should



be ready when an inspection date is allocated to us by the HEC. Prof Newton is visiting us this week and he will spend a substantial amount of time checking our progress providing feedback on the work we have done so far.

Achieving institutional accreditation is perhaps the most important activity in the University and should be our top priority over the next few months. As I mentioned many times before, the visiting panel will attend classes and observe the quality of teaching in the classrooms. In addition, they will scrutinize all our supporting materials including course portfolios, course syllabi, assessment methods, and achievements of learning outcomes by students, website and marketing materials amongst many other things. We need to be well prepared and everything we do should be to the highest quality.
