MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 46th issue of the 2nd year of the President's News Digest.

In this issue I will be highlighting the University's priorities over the next few months.



Last week, the University was buzzing with so many activities including the welcome reception of all existing and new staff hosted by the Chairman of the BOT and the President, HEA training, students' admission and registration, the arrival of new academic and administrative staff, and the first "all staff meeting" held this academic year.

In this "all staff meeting", which was attended by around 100 existing staff and 35 new staff, I welcomed all returning and new colleagues and briefed them about our top priorities for the next few months. Our top priority remains the preparation for institutional accreditation. In this meeting, I briefed all colleagues about the 8 areas of accreditation, the 33 standards and 218 Key Indicators and presented progress in this area including the submission of the accreditation application to the HEC and writing of the SER and collection of evidence and supporting materials. This work is coordinated by the Accreditation Group, which meets on a weekly basis. Ms Tania circulated the accreditation handbook in both Arabic and English in order to encourage our colleagues, particularly the new ones, to read it and to become familiar with the requirements for accreditation. During staff induction week, the VP Academic Affairs and Development will brief our new colleagues more about accreditation including its benefits and their involvement.

Another priority for the coming semester is the successful launch of our new British programmes including the foundation year for all 4 programmes with LSBU and Cardiff Met. Students' registration, use of learning resources including Moodle, study plans, programmes' handbooks, quality delivery of all courses, smooth running of the programmes, continuous communication with our British partners and many other aspects should be addressed and looked after really properly. Quality should be at the heart of delivering these programmes.



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It is worth noting that the successful running of these programmes will raise our profile and help us market these programmes and attract more students. Our colleagues from Cardiff Met and LSBU will soon visit the University and induct our staff, delivering these programmes, and students who are studying on these programmes. During staff induction this week, and students' orientation next week, staff and students will be informed more about these British programmes.

A third priority is our Marketing and Student Recruitment. Students are the bread and butter of our University; we should recruit them and retain them. Student recruitment is a collective effort and we should all have a role to play. This is becoming now a very competitive issue and we should devise new and innovative approaches to student recruitment. The University prospectus, programmes' handbook and other marketing materials, website, social media, visits to schools, open days, media presence, publicising our academic activities and achievements (Staff and Students), organising research conferences and seminars, participation in community engagement projects, promoting the quality of educational delivery of our programmes, engaging with key stakeholders, particularly private and public schools, and highlighting the financial aid and support we are providing can help us in this area. Marketing and student recruitment is in part art and in part science. Putting detailed and rigorous plans is really important, but it is as important to use our networks including our alumni and students to promote the good work of the **University**, as the words of mouth are also really important.

Other priorities this semester include the **submission of the HEC annual report by the end of September, updating of KPIs, keeping the website up to date, periodic programme reviews, NQF preparation, new improvement plans** that have to be in place this semester for programmes in Arts and Science, **CIOB event** on 24 September, **graduation ceremony** to be held on 25 October, and finally the **international conference** to be held in November (26 to 27).

I would like to conclude this edition by reminding all colleagues that **teaching for the first semester starts on**Monday and we should all be prepared to provide our students with the best University's experience.

New Students Orientation Guidelines ACAD 12

- **♣** access registration information and validate their e-mail account
- **4** ask pertinent questions about programs of study, important dates to remember,
- **♣** academic support services,
- **♣** know what it takes to be successful in academics

The Deanship of Student Affairs will ensure that the orientation programme is planned in a fun and engaging manner (including a tour of the University), with the involvement of the Student Council and other students.
